

Monthly Summary – February 2019

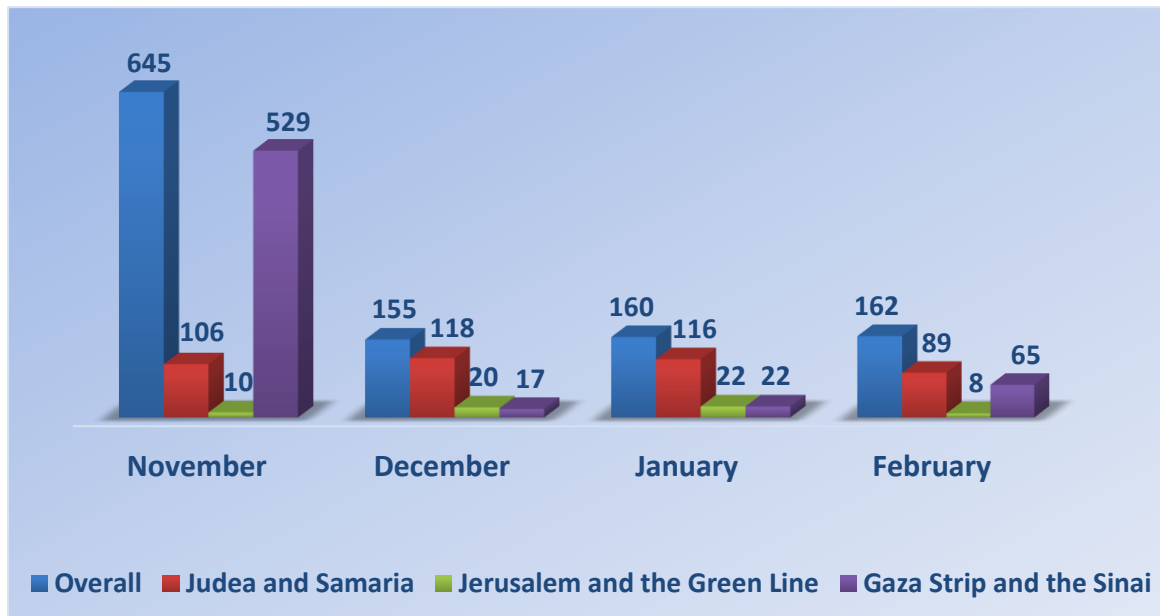
The number of terrorist attacks in February 2019 **remained similar to January**: 162, compared to 160.

In Judea and Samaria, 89 attacks were executed in February, down from January's 116. **8 attacks** took place **in Jerusalem**, as opposed to 22 in the preceding month. **No attacks** were executed **within the Green Line** in February, similarly to January. Finally, **65 attacks originated from the Gaza Strip and the Sinai Peninsula** in February, up from 22 in January.

One person was killed and two were injured by terrorist activity in February 2019.

A civilian was murdered in a stabbing in Jerusalem on 7 February. **One member of the security forces suffered mild injuries** from a pipe bomb in the Gaza Strip area on 15 February. Finally, **one member of the security forces suffered serious injuries** from an IED in the Gaza Strip on 17 February.

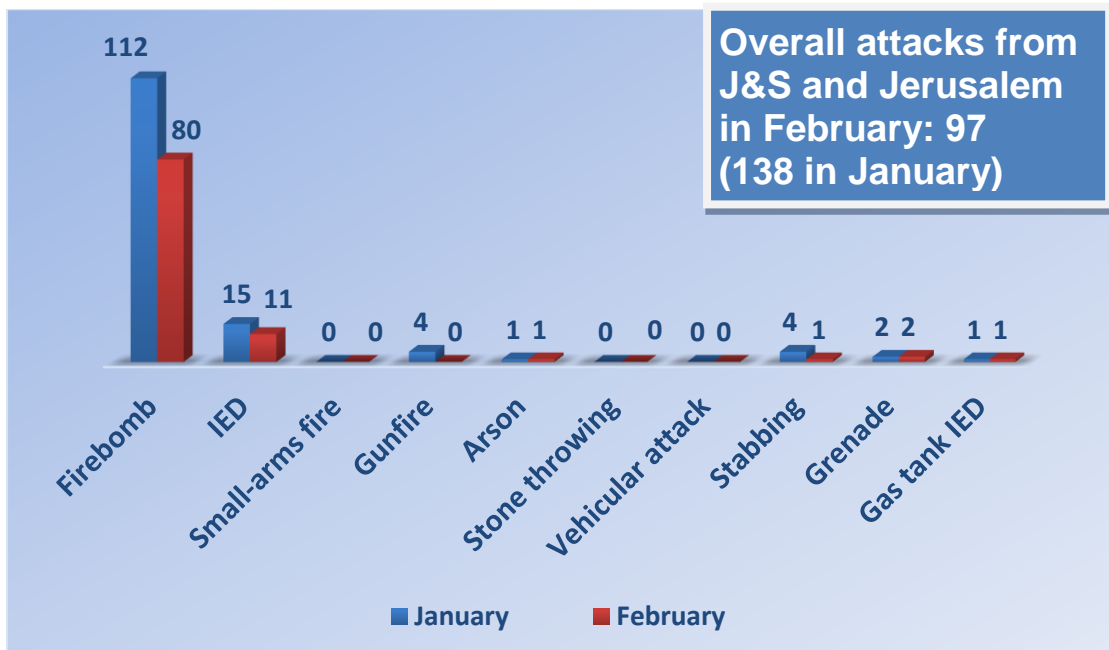
Distribution of Terrorist Attacks in February 2019,
Compared to Preceding Months



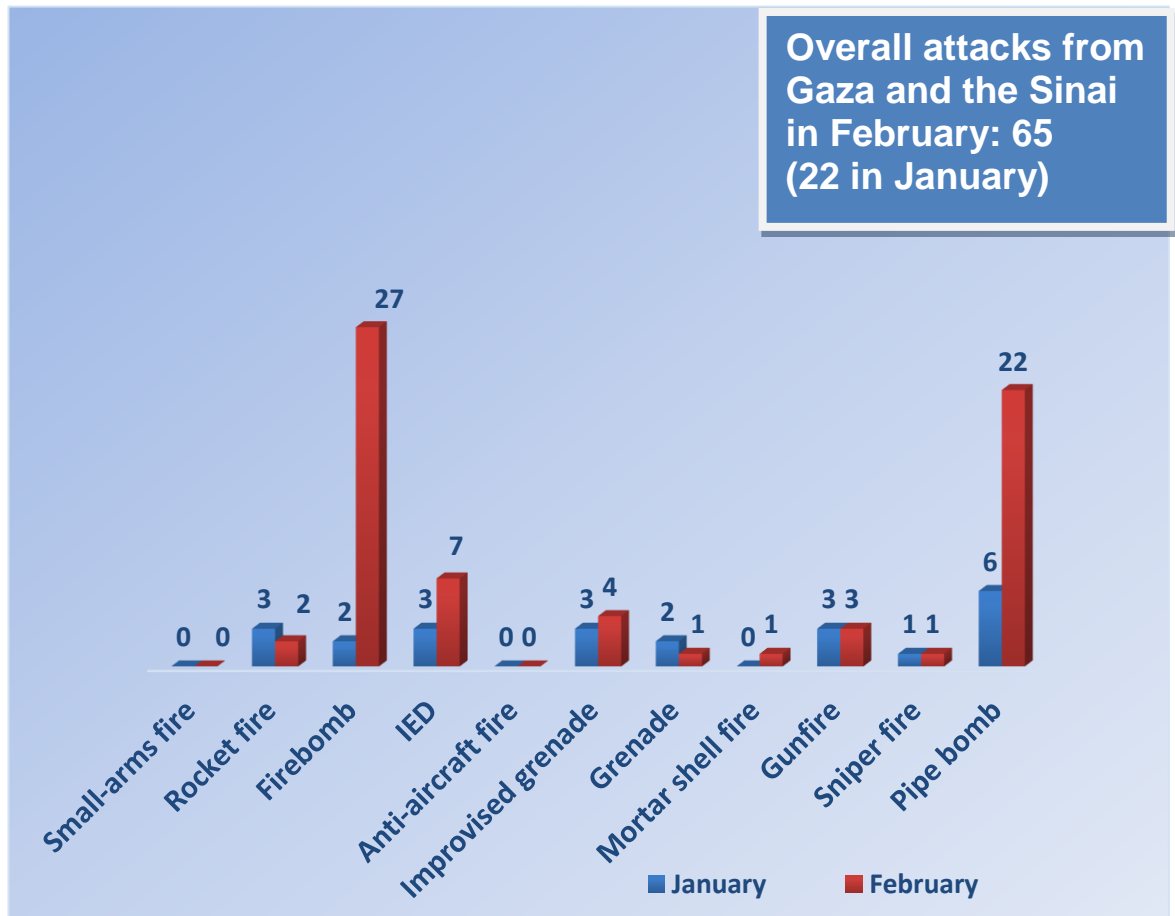
Distribution of Terrorist Attacks in February 2019
by Region and Type of Attack

In Judea & Samaria and Jerusalem – 97 attacks: 80 firebombs; 11 pipe bombs; one stabbing; two grenade attacks; and one gas tank IED attack.

Indirect Fire from the Gaza Strip and the Sinai Peninsula

In February 2019, two rocket-launching* attacks were directed from the Gaza Strip at Israel, compared to three such rocket-launching attacks in January.

***Clarification:** The number of launchings is the number of rockets/mortar shells actually launched during one indirect fire attack. For example: one attack may consist of three launches, that is, three rockets / mortar shells, and so it will be counted as one attack and three launches.
